

Strategic partnership with Tangalooma EcoMarines (TEM)

A school-based program encouraging education and action on local environmental issues that affect the marine habitat and wildlife of Moreton Bay and Islands.



On a mission to save the bay





BCEC collects and stores 226,000 kilolitres of rainwater, which is used for cleaning, irrigation and toilet flushing.



Lighting and air-conditioning at BCEC



Manually controlled around event times.



Staff mode can be enabled for events setting up.



Bluetooth-controlled light harvesting in the main foyer.



LED lighting retrofit project underway – commenced in 2014 and will be 80% complete by the end of 2019.

BCEC's organic waste dehydrator (a.k.a Herbie)



Converts **200kg** of organic waste per day into **20kg** of sterile biomass – using only heat.



Biomass from Herbie is used as soil enhancer in South Bank, Roma Street Parklands and BCEC staff gardens.



Reduces food waste to landfill by **60,000kg** per year.



BCEC redirects discarded materials into


30 different waste streams, including:

BCEC are partners with FoodBank, Australia's largest hunger relief organisation, donating pre-packaged meals on a regular basis.

BCEC has donated 144,271 meals to date.



Containers for Change

BCEC has rolled out Containers for Change bins for public events and behind the scenes.

With 10 cents per bottle, BCEC has raised over \$5,000 since the start of 2019.
